

## Certified Green Buildings at UNC Charlotte

UNC Charlotte has certified building design and construction using two systems. Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design, or LEED, is a certification from the [US Green Building Council](#). There are 4 levels in LEED: Certified, Silver, Gold, and Platinum. Green Globes is a certification from the [Green Building Initiative](#). There are 4 levels in Green Globes, designated by increasing numbers.

Since the first award in 2009, the University has certified the design and construction of 77% of eligible building space based on square feet. For large (>40,000 square feet) buildings constructed in this era, the University has sought and received certification for 12 of 15 new buildings and 81% of eligible constructed space.
